Beginning in this addition of The Towner Tattler, we will now feature a recent donation in each issue! Our first Featured Donation is the medical kit pictured below. This is a physician's amputation kit used in the American Civil War by Belvidere physican, Dr. Amos Scott. Dr A. Scott was the first in a lineage of 5 generations of the Scott family to practice medicine. He and his son Dr. Charles Scott cared for Belvidere citizens for many years. We are so appreciative of the Dr. James Scott's donation of this amputation kit, along with several other medical tools. James is the 5th and final generation of Scott physicians who so kindly offered this treasured collection to the Boone County Historical Society.

Despite delays due to Covid, quite a bit of progress is being made on the beautiful Funderburg House! Thanks to Belvidere's own Ollmann, Ernest, Martin Architecture



firm, we are well on our way to beginning updates on the home that will allow for ADA accessibility of the first floor. Eventually, there will be an accessible restroom on the first floor, as well as a wheelchair lift installed. Thanks to the wonderful architects at OEM, there is a plan in place to allow for these modifications with very minimal changes made to the house itself.

There are many other projects in the works at the Funderburg House. Flaws in the plaster have been repaired, and preparations are being made to have all of the wool rugs in the house cleaned and carpet padding replaced. Discussions are in progress regarding the



refinishing of wood floors, and restoring wall coverings.

Please drive by and take a look at the landscaping work! Area Services did a fantastic job clearing weeds, trimming trees, and laying mulch. Unfortunately, there were two trees that had become hazardous, and were taken down. BCMH staff and boards would like to extend a big Thank You to the City of Belvidere street department for doing a wonderful job of removing those trees.
